Levamisole is an anthelmintic with immunomodulatory and anti-inflammatory properties. It has reportedly been used as an Off Label medication for Equine Protozoal Myelitis. Its use for this and other treatments has been potentially problematic, as levamisole metabolizes to other regulated substances (aminorex and pemoline. Both aminorex and pemoline are Class A substances in Kentucky, Class 1 substances on the ARCI list and banned by HISA.) For some time, there was very little information regarding multipleday administration. Notably, levamisole as a single medication is FDA-approved as a dewormer for many other species but not equines.

Levamisole Timeline

- In September 2012 the KHRC issued a memorandum reclassifying levamisole from a Class B to a Class A substance.
- In December 2012 a horse tested positive for levamisole, leading to a disqualification of the horse as well as a fine and suspension for the trainer in February 2013.
- In April 2014 following an administrative hearing, the KHRC adopted the Recommended Order affirming the stewards ruling.
- In June 2015 the trainer appealed to Franklin Circuit Court and won. Judge Philip Shepherd held that "the classification of levamisole as a Class A substance is arbitrary and capricious."
- In August 2015 the EDRC voted to classify aminorex as a Class A substance and also to classify levamisole as a Class B substance and commission a study to

determine if Levamisole administration leads to aminorex, and also determine and appropriate withdrawal period for levamisole.

• In August 2015 the Commission voted to declassify Levamisole.

Levamisole Study

The EDRC-approved study was performed and samples were collected and analyzed in 2019.

The data was studied, a paper was written, and the project was presented at the AAEP convention in San Antonio in November 2022. The study showed an extended clearance time for levamisole, with aminorex being detected in the urine for about three days following the 7-day administration of levamisole. Levamisole was detected in one of the six horses in the study at 21 days following the last administration.

Levamisole is currently classified as a Class II substance by the ARCI and a Class B substance by HISA.

Recommendation

The EDRC at its January 27, 2023, meeting heard the presentation regarding the levamisole administration study and discussed the re-inclusion of levamisole on the KHRC medication list as a Class B. The EDRC voted unanimously to place levamisole on the KHRC list as a Class B substance.

The KHRC staff feels that Levamisole should be placed back on the KHRC list as a Class B to be in alignment with ARCI and HISA listings. We would also recommend that any horse which has been given levamisole within the past 30 days be tested prior to racing.

The KHRC staff recommends approval.

(Amendment)

810 KAR 8:020. Drug, medication, and substance classification schedule.

RELATES TO: KRS 230.215, 230.225, 230.240, 230.260, 230.265, 230.290, 230.320, 230.370

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 230.215(2), 230.225, 230.240(2), 230.260, 230.320, 230.370

NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) authorizes the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (the "commission") to promulgate administrative regulations prescribing conditions under which all legitimate horse racing and wagering thereon is conducted in Kentucky. KRS 230.240(2) requires the commission to promulgate administrative regulations restricting or prohibiting the administration of drugs or stimulants or other improper acts to horses prior to the horse participating in a race. This administrative regulation establishes the drug classification schedule in effect in Kentucky for permitted drugs, medications, and substances that may be administered to race horses competing in Kentucky.

Section 1. The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Uniform Drug, Medication, and Substance Classification Schedule.

(1) This administrative regulation shall establish the respective classifications of all substances contained herein.

- 1 (a) Class A drugs, medications, and substances are those that:
- 2 1. Have the highest potential to influence performance in the equine athlete, regardless of their
- 3 approval by the United States Food and Drug Administration; or
- 4 2. Lack approval by the United States Food and Drug Administration, but have pharmacologic
- 5 effects similar to certain Class B drugs, medications, or substances that are approved by the
- 6 United States Food and Drug Administration.

1. Introduction

Levamisole is sometimes administered to racchorses to treat EPM or pharyngeal lymphoid hyperplasia. Metabolites of levamisole, aminorex and pemoline, are ARCI Class I Foreign Substances. The presence of levamisole and some metabolites in post-race regulatory samples is prohibited. Previous studies have examined single doses of the drug, and the paucity of data on the disposition of levamisole after multiple, consecutive doses led to this study being performed. This study examined the disposition of levamisole in serum and urine after 7 days of a typical dosing regimen.

2. Materials and Methods

Six healthy Thoroughbred geldings were treated with 500 mg of levamisole hydrochloride orally at 12-hour

intervals for 7 days. Serum and urine samples were analyzed over a 28-day period and pharmacokinetic parameters determined.

3. Results

The terminal half-life of levamisole in serum was highly variable between horses. Following the final dose: serum levamisole was above LOD in 5/6 horses for 3-14 days (one horse remained over LOD on the last testing day), compound II was below LOD in all 6 horses by 14 days. Aminorex and pemoline were not detected in serum in the post-administration period.

In urine following the final dose, levamisole was below LOD on Day 6 and aminorex was below LOD on Day 3. Compound II was above LOD in 4/6 horses on the last day of sampling (Day 28).

Take Home

- Variable clearance time between horses
- Compound II detected longer than other analytes
- Levamisole may be detected in both serum and urine for a minimum of 21 days following 7 days of twice daily administration
- Accumulation indices: effect of multi-day administration

On January 31, 2023, the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) Advisory Committee reviewed Keeneland Association, Inc.'s (Keeneland) request to approve its KTDF purse structure as submitted for its 2023 Spring Race Meet. Keeneland's 2023 Spring Race Meet will consist of fifteen (15) race dates beginning on Friday, April 7, 2023, and ending on Friday, April 28, 2023.

Keeneland's purse structure proposes KTDF purses in the range of \$4.7-\$4.9 million. These projections are based on Keeneland's KTDF balance of \$1 million at the end of its 2022 Fall Race Meet, a projected \$1 million credit subject to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission's (KHRC) approval of Kentucky Downs' transfer request, and projected KTDF earnings of \$2.9 million through April 28, 2023, from projected parimutuel revenues. Keeneland will pay KTDF purses through the last place, KTDF-eligible finisher in each race referenced to encourage participation in its 2023 Spring Race Meet.

The KTDF Advisory Committee supports this request to bolster Keeneland's 2023 Spring Race Meet which will further enhance the overall thoroughbred racing circuit in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Keeneland has reviewed our KTDF data and would like to offer approximately \$4.7 million – \$4.9 million in KTDF money for our upcoming Spring meet.

- We are projecting approximate daily earnings of \$15,892 per day, an increase over Spring 2022;
- 2. We have a surplus of \$1,019,664 following the Fall 2022 race meeting,
- 3. We are assuming a payout percentage of approximately 88% of the amount carded;
- We are projecting total KRM and OG earnings of approximately \$2,952,000 plus a KTDF transfer of \$1,000,000;
- 5. We anticipate that KTDF purses will comprise approximately 25.8% of total purses.
 - a. MSW, ALW, AOC: \$2,787,000 (57.7% of the KTDF allotment)
 - b. CL, MCL, SA: \$538,600 (11.2% of the KTDF allotment)
 - c. Stakes: \$1,500,000 (31.1% of the KTDF allotment)

We remain committed to offering competitive purses while also prudently allocating our KTDF funds available. To that end we will increase our KTDF purse amounts and add KTDF funds to claiming, maiden claiming, and starter allowance races for Spring 2023 with the goal of gradually reducing our KTDF surplus over several meets and finding the right balance for our purse levels.

Keeneland will continue to pay out KTDF funds through last place. A table containing the payout percentage by field size is attached. In the event there is a dead heat for finish positions 1 thru 5, the KTDF percentage payout for each position will be aggregated and paid equally to each horse included in the dead heat. If a non-KTDF eligible horse is involved in a dead heat, those funds will revert to the fund.

We will evaluate the earnings and payout percentages several days into our race meet and may need to make adjustments if our actual earnings and payout percentages are significantly different from our assumptions.

Churchill Downs' 2023 Spring Race Meet will consist of forty four (44) race dates beginning on Saturday, April 29, 2023, and ending on Monday, July 3, 2023.

Churchill Downs' purse structure proposes KTDF purses in the range of \$9.5-\$10 million. These projections are based on projected KTDF earnings of \$8.3 million through April 29, 2023, from projected pari-mutuel revenues and additional projected KTDF earnings of \$4.7 million through July 31, 2023, from the same. Churchill Downs will pay KTDF purses through the last place, KTDF-eligible finisher in each race referenced to encourage participation in its 2023 Spring Race Meet.

The KTDF Advisory Committee supports this request to bolster Churchill Downs' 2023 Spring Race Meet which will further enhance the overall thoroughbred racing circuit in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Churchill Downs has reviewed its purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$9.5 million to \$10.0 million for our upcoming Spring Meet. We have based the range on the following information:

- 1. At the end of April 2023, Churchill Downs is projecting an ending KTDF earned balance of \$8.3 million.
- 2. Our 2023 Spring Meet will consist of 44 racing days beginning Saturday, April 29th and ending Monday, July 3rd. We are projecting additional earnings of \$4.7 million by the end of July. The primary driver is the KTDF earned from pari-mutuel wagering from Derby City Gaming LLC ("Derby City") from the beginning of May 2023 through the end of the Spring Meet.
- 3. We anticipate that KTDF will be approximately 24% of total purses. Of the requested KTDF allotment, we anticipate the following payouts:
 - a. ALW, AOC, SMSW, MDN: approximately 61% of the KTDF allotment
 - b. BCL, CLM, MCL, STR, WMC: approximately 16% of the KTDF allotment; and
 - c. Stakes: approximately 23% of the KTDF allotment
- 4. For Spring 2023, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 86.5% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$9.8 million which is \$0.2 million higher than the \$9.6 million paid during the Spring 2022 Meet. The driver of higher purses paid is a function of two planned additional race days due to cancelation from extreme heat in 2022.
- 5. To encourage participation during the Spring Meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Given several years of robust business during the period beginning 2019 through August 2022, the state-of-the-art historical racing machines at nearby Derby City Gaming has generated \$40.9 million in KTDF for horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky-breds to run for in designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and allowance optional claiming races with a claiming price of not less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) contested at Churchill Downs Racetrack. Continuing in Fall 2022, Churchill Downs Racetrack will offer KTDF money on all claiming races.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred and sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their horses. Stallion owners are responsible for registering their stallions.

RE: PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO 810 KAR 7:040

On January 9, 2023, the Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund/Kentucky Standardbred Breeders Incentive Fund Advisory Panel (KSDF/KSBIF Advisory Panel) met and agreed upon the attached amendments to 810 KAR 7:040.

The main objectives of the amendments are as follows:

- Create an opportunity to participate in instances where the Mare Certificate of Eligibility Nomination was missed.
- Allow for a Yearling to late nominate within its yearling year, even if the mare was not nominated during the calendar year of the breeding season.
- Allow for a three (3) year-old to participate, even if no sustaining payments were made as a two (2) year-old. However, the proposed amendments will keep the initial March 15th two (2) year-old sustaining payment mandatory to encourage two (2) year-old participation.
- Change the declaration/starting fees to one-half of one percent (0.5%) of the total purses distributed or to be distributed for each race in which the horse is declared.

The proposed amendments are outlined in the attached documents and include forms that will be incorporated into the regulation if approved.

The KSDF/KSBIF Advisory Panel and Kentucky Horse Racing Commission staff recommend approval of the proposed amendments.

810 KAR 7:040. KENTUCKY STANDARDBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND AND KENTUCKY STANDARDBRED

BREEDERS' INCENTIVE FUND.

RELATES TO: KRS 230.215, 230.260, 230.770, 230.802

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 230.215(2), 230.260(8), 230.770(1), (6), (7), 230.802(2)(b)

NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) and 230.260(8) authorize the

Kentucky Horse Racing Commission to promulgate administrative regulations prescribing the conditions

under which horse racing shall be conducted in Kentucky and to fix and regulate the minimum amount of

purses, stakes, or awards to be offered for the conduct of any horse race meeting. KRS 230.770(1)

establishes the Kentucky standardbred development fund. KRS 230.770(6) and (7) authorize the

commission to promulgate administrative regulations establishing the eligibility of horses participating in

races for which a portion of the purse is provided by the Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund and

the conditions, class, and quality of the races. KRS 230.802(1) establishes the Kentucky standardbred

breeders' incentive fund. KRS 230.802(2)(b) requires the commission to promulgate administrative

regulations establishing the conditions and criteria for the distribution of moneys from the fund. This

administrative regulation establishes eligibility standards, administrative practices to enforce the

standards, criteria for the distribution of moneys from these funds, mandatory criteria for races, and the

administration of purses and payments in these races.

Section 1. Definitions.

(1) "Commission" means the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

- (2) "Consolation" means the race following a series of preliminary legs for the next preferred horses, as established in Section 6 of this administrative regulation, which did not qualify for the finals of each racing division of the Kentucky Sire Stakes program.
- (3) "Final" means the race following a series of preliminary legs established to determine the divisional champion of each racing division of the Sire Stakes Program.
- (4) "Kentucky-bred" means a standardbred horse that is:
- (a) Foaled out of a standardbred mare that is registered with the commission and meets the requirements of this administrative regulation [is a resident of Kentucky]; or
- (b) Sired by a standardbred stallion residing in Kentucky that meets the requirements of this administrative regulation.
- (5) "Kentucky Sire Stakes" means the series of races held annually in Kentucky for two (2) and three (3) year old Kentucky-bred fillies and colts, both trotting and pacing, and funded in whole or in part by the Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund or the Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund.
- (6) "KSBIF" means the Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund as established in KRS 230.802.
- (7) "KSDF" means the Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund as established in KRS 230.770.
- (8) "Stallion residing in Kentucky" means a stallion physically located and standing in Kentucky for 180 days of the calendar year in which the stallion is registered that, does not service mares in any other state, jurisdiction, or country outside Kentucky during the calendar year in which the stallion is registered.
- (9) "USTA" means the United States Trotting Association.

Section 2. Domicile Requirements.

(1)

(a) An owner, lessee, stallion manager, or syndicate manager of a standardbred stallion residing in Kentucky who desires to use the stallion to breed and to have his progeny eligible for the KSDF or KSBIF

shall register the stallion with the commission by December 31st of the year of conception of the horse sought to be eligible by submitting a completed "KSDF/KSBIF Stallion Certificate of Eligibility Form", KHRC 7-040-2.

- (b) Standardbred stallions not residing in Kentucky are not required to register with the commission. The progeny of a standardbred stallion not residing in Kentucky is not eligible for the KSDF or KSBIF unless the progeny is that of a standardbred mare registered under and meeting the requirements of this administrative regulation.
- (c) All standardbred stallions shall be registered with the USTA, Standardbred Canada, or other appropriate international harness racing governing agency whether residing in Kentucky or not.

(2)

- (a) An owner, lessee, manager, or syndicate manager of a standardbred mare who desires to use the mare for breeding purposes and to have her progeny eligible for the KSDF or KSBIF shall register the mare by December 31st of the year of conception of the horse sought to be eligible by submitting a completed "KSDF/KSBIF Mare Certificate of Eligibility Form", KHRC 7-040-3.
- (b) To be eligible for registration, the mare shall:
- 1. Be registered with the USTA, Standardbred Canada, or other appropriate international harness racing governing agency; and
- 2. Have resided in Kentucky for a period of not less than 180 days in the calendar year of conception of the horse sought to be eligible.
- (c) If a horse is conceived by embryo and ovum transplant (ET), both the donor mare and recipient mare shall be registered during the year of conception, and the recipient mare shall reside in Kentucky for a period of not less than 180 days in the calendar year of conception of the horse sought to be eligible.

- (3) Registrations shall be received by the commission by the close of business or postmarked on the deadline established in this section in order to be eligible.
- (4) An owner, lessee, stallion manager, manager, or syndicate manager of a stallion or mare eligible for the KSDF and KSBIF shall be responsible for:
 - (a) The registrations and records of the farm where the stallion stands or the mare resides; and
 - (b) Complying with all applicable requirements of this administrative regulation.

Section 3. Eligibility.

- (1) In order to qualify for the Kentucky Sire Stakes, a foal shall be a two (2) or three (3) year old Kentucky-bred and maintain eligibility for the KSDF and KSBIF.
- (2)
 - (a) Except as provided by paragraph (b) of this subsection, only a foal that is the first born to a mare (donor or recipient) in each calendar year produced by any method, including embryo and ovum transplant (ET), shall be eligible for the Kentucky Sire Stakes.
- (b) Natural birth twins produced from the same pregnancy and foaling by the natural, nonrecipient mare shall also be eligible.
- (3) Any future offspring of foals ineligible for racing under this section shall be ineligible for the Kentucky Sire Stakes.
- Section 4. Distance. Each Kentucky Sire Stakes race shall be a one (1) mile dash.
- Section 5. Post Positions. Post positions for the final, consolation, and all preliminary legs of the Kentucky Sire Stakes race shall be an open draw with two (2) horses drawn for the final and consolation races that are designated as "also eligibles" under Section 6(7) of this administrative regulation.
- Section 6. Eligibility for the Final and Consolation Races.
 - (1) Beginning with the 2018 Kentucky Sire Stakes races, consolation races may be eligible for funding.

- (2) A horse that does not start in at least one (1) of the preliminary legs scheduled shall not be eligible for the final or consolation.
 - (a) All horses earning points may enter in the final with:
 - 1. The top eight (8) point earners, if the horses raced on a half (1/2) mile track or five-eighths (5/8) mile track; or
 - 2. Top ten (10) point earners, if the horses raced on a one (1) mile track, to be declared eligible.
 - (b) On a half (1/2) mile track or five-eighths (5/8) mile track, the top eight (8) point earners shall not be eligible for the consolation. On a one (1) mile track, the top ten (10) point earners shall not be eligible for the consolation.
 - (c) A horse that is eligible to race in the final shall only be eligible to race in the final, unless the horse is qualified as an also eligible.
 - (d) A horse that is eligible to race in the consolation shall only be eligible to race in the consolation, unless qualified in the final as an also eligible.
 - (e) A horse that scratches from the final shall not race in the consolation.
 - (f) A horse that has qualified for the final or consolation shall remain eligible for the final or consolation.
 - (g) At least seven (7) eligible horses shall be declared for a consolation race to be contested.
 - (h) A horse that is automatically eligible to race in the final race shall not start in the consolation race.
- (3) A horse that enters a preliminary leg that does not fill and is not raced shall receive credit toward fulfilling the minimum starting requirements established in subsection (2) of this section and toward determining tiebreaker status as established in subsection (6)(b) of this section.
- (4) A horse that has been scratched from an event that is raced shall not receive credit toward meeting the starting requirements established in subsection (2) of this section.
- (5) A horse, in order to start in the final or consolation, shall be declared at the host track where the race is being held on or before the time posted on the track condition sheet.

(6)

- (a) If the number of horses eligible and declared into any final or consolation event exceeds the maximum number specified by the KSDF or KSBIF or the number of positions on the starting gate, the following point system as applied to KSDF preliminary legs shall determine preference for the final:
 - 1. 1st place fifty (50) points;
 - 2. 2nd place twenty-five (25) points;
 - 3. 3rd place twelve (12) points;
 - 4. 4th place eight (8) points;
 - 5. 5th place five (5) points;
 - 6. 6th place and all other starters one (1) point; and
 - 7. A horse finishing in a dead heat for any position in a preliminary leg shall be awarded an equal share of the total number of points awarded for that position.
- (b) If there is a tie among horses after the awarding of points pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection, there shall be a drawing by lot among those horses tied in total points to determine which horses shall be included in the final field.
- (c) If a horse that is qualified for the final or consolation is not declared, the horse with the next highest point total, pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection, that is declared shall be eligible for the final or consolation.
- (7) Also eligibles.
 - (a) The two (2) horses accumulating the highest point total, pursuant to subsection (6) of this section, that are declared into the final or consolation, but do not qualify for the final or consolation, shall be designated "also eligible". The horse with the highest point total from the preliminary legs shall be designated as the "first also eligible" and the horse with the next highest point total shall be designated as the "second also eligible".

- (b) A horse that is scratched in the final or consolation shall be replaced by the "first also eligible" and then the "second also eligible", if necessary.
 - 1. If post positions have not been drawn at the time of the scratch, the "also eligible" shall take the place of the horse that has been scratched and shall participate in the normal draw.
- 2. If post positions have been drawn at the time of the scratch, the "also eligible" shall assume the post position of the horse that has been scratched.
- 3. A horse shall not be moved into the final or consolation as a replacement after the official scratch time deadline that is in effect at the host track.

Section 7. Final Order of Finish. The judges' "official order of finish" shall be used in determining eligibility to the final exclusive of all appeals yet to be decided at the time of closing of the entry box for final events.

Section 8. Detention. All starters shall be subject to the detention policy of the racetrack.

Section 9. Number of Starters.

- (1) There shall not be more than:
 - (a) Ten (10) starters in each final race on a one (1) mile track; and
 - (b) Eight (8) horses on a one-half (1/2) or five-eighths (5/8) mile track.
- (2) All horses shall be on the gate for the final race.

Section 10. Declaration Fees.

- (1) For each horse declared to race in a preliminary leg, there shall be a declaration fee of <u>one-half of one percent</u> (0.5%) of the total purses distributed or to be distributed for each race in which the horse is declared. [\$500. If a preliminary leg splits into two (2) or more divisions, the declaration fee shall be \$500 per division.]
- (2) The declaration fee shall be due to the racing association at the time of declaration and payable one
- (1) hour prior to post time of the race.
- (3) Purses for the KSDF and KSBIF shall consist of money from:

- (a) Nominating fees;
- (b) Sustaining fees;
- (c) Declaration fees; and
- (d) Added money from the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

(4)

- (a) Distribution of revenue for Kentucky Sire Stakes races shall be reviewed and addressed annually, not later than December 15 of each calendar year, by an advisory panel appointed by the Chairman of the commission and consisting of one (1) representative from each of the following:
 - 1. The commission, who shall serve as the chairman of the panel;
 - 2. The Kentucky Harness Horseman's Association;
 - 3. The Kentucky Harness Association;
 - 4. The host racetrack; and
 - 5. One (1) participant in the fund nominated by the chairman of the commission from a group of up to four (4) nominees recommended by each of the above four (4) members having one (1) nomination each.
- (b) Each member of the panel shall serve from July 1 through June 30 of the following year and shall be a resident of Kentucky.
- (c) The final determination regarding distribution of revenue shall be made by the commission.

 Section 11. Divisions of Preliminary Legs.
 - (1) The total number of horses entered shall determine the number of divisions of the preliminary legs that shall be required.
 - (2) Preliminary legs shall be split into divisions as follows:
 - (a) One (1) mile track:
 - 1. Twelve (12) horses or less entered one (1) division race.

- 2. Thirteen (13) to twenty (20) horses entered two (2) divisions.
- 3. Twenty-one (21) to thirty (30) horses entered three (3) divisions.
- 4. Thirty-one (31) to forty (40) horses entered four (4) divisions.
- 5. Forty-one (41) to fifty (50) horses entered five (5) divisions.
- 6. Fifty-one (51) to sixty (60) horses entered six (6) divisions.
- (b) One-half (1/2) and five-eighths (5/8) mile track:
 - 1. Nine (9) to ten (10) horses entered one (1) division.
 - 2. Eleven (11) to sixteen (16) horses entered two (2) divisions.
 - 3. Seventeen (17) to twenty-four (24) horses entered three (3) divisions.
 - 4. Twenty-five (25) to thirty-two (32) horses entered four (4) divisions.
 - 5. Thirty-three (33) to forty (40) horses entered five (5) divisions.
 - 6. Forty-one (41) to forty-eight (48) horses entered six (6) divisions.
- (c) If the need exists for seven (7) or more divisions, eligibility to the final shall be determined in a manner consistent with the published conditions.

Section 12. Gait.

- (1) Gait shall be specified by the owner of the horse on or before the first two (2) year old payment.
- (2)
 - (a) Change of gait may be made at the time of declaration at the track.
 - (b) Sustaining payments shall remain in the funds of the original gait specified.
- (3) A horse shall not race on both gaits in the same year.

Section 13. Divisions. A race shall be raced in separate divisions as follows:

- (1) Colt, gelding, ridgeling divisions; and
- (2) Filly divisions.

Section 14. Purse Distributions.

- (1) The purses awarded for all races shall be distributed on the following percentage basis:
 - (a) Five (5) starters fifty (50) percent, twenty-five (25) percent, twelve (12) percent, eight (8) percent, and five (5) percent;
 - (b) Four (4) starters fifty (50) percent, twenty-five (25) percent, twelve (12) percent, eight (8) percent, and the remaining five (5) percent reverts back to the fund;
 - (c) Three (3) starters fifty (50) percent, twenty-five (25) percent, twelve (12) percent, and the remaining thirteen (13) percent reverts back to the fund;
 - (d) Two (2) starters fifty (50) percent, and twenty-five (25) percent, and the remaining twenty-five (25) percent reverts back to the fund; and
 - (e) One (1) starter fifty (50) percent, and the remaining fifty (50) percent reverts back to the fund.
- (2) The percentage basis established by subsection (1) of this section shall apply at each of the Kentucky pari-mutuel tracks.

Section 15. Cancellations.

- (1) If circumstances prevent the racing of an event and the race is not drawn, all funds allocated to the division in each of the preliminary legs or the final shall be refunded and prorated to the owners of the horses eligible at the time of cancellation.
- (2) The eligible horses shall include only horses that made the payments required by Section 20 of this administrative regulation.
- (3) The added monies provided by the Commonwealth of Kentucky for use in the KSDF and KSBIF shall be disbursed by December 15 of each calendar year in accordance with the formula created by the panel as set out in Section 10(4) of this administrative regulation.

Section 16. Qualifying.

(1) Any horse declared into a Kentucky Sires Stakes race shall:

- (a) Show at least one (1) charted race line with no breaks within forty-five (45) days prior to the day of the race; and
- (b) Have satisfied the following time requirements:
 - 1. On a track larger than five-eighths (5/8) of a mile:
 - a. A two (2) year old trotter shall have been timed in two minutes and six seconds (2:06) or faster;
 - b. A two (2) year old pacer shall have been timed in two minutes and four seconds (2:04) or faster;
 - c. A three (3) year old trotter shall have been timed in two minutes and two seconds (2:02) or faster; and
 - d. A three (3) year old pacer shall have been timed in two minutes and zero seconds (2:00) or faster.
 - 2. On a five-eighths (5/8) mile track:
 - a. A two (2) year old trotter shall have been timed in two minutes and seven seconds (2:07) or faster;
 - b. A two (2) year old pacer shall have been timed in two minutes and five seconds (2:05) or faster;
 - c. A three (3) year old trotter shall have been timed in two minutes and three seconds (2:03) or faster; and
 - d. A three (3) year old pacer shall have been timed in two minutes and one second (2:01) or faster.
 - 3. On a one-half (1/2) mile track:
 - a. A two (2) year old trotter shall have been timed in two minutes and eight seconds (2:08) or faster;
 - b. A two (2) year old pacer shall have been timed in two minutes and six seconds (2:06) or faster;
 - c. A three (3) year old trotter shall have been timed in two minutes and four seconds (2:04) or faster; and
 - d. A three (3) year old pacer shall have been timed in two minutes and two seconds (2:02) or faster.
- (2) A horse shall be scratched from a race if the person declaring the horse has failed to advise the race secretary of a start that is not reflected on the electronic eligibilities.

- (3) The requirements of this section shall apply both to wagering and nonwagering races.
- Section 17. Purse Allocations.
 - (1) At a scheduled meeting of the commission, the commission shall:
 - (a) Establish the distribution of funds for stakes races for the upcoming year; and
 - (b) Authorize expenditures at a time it designates.
 - (2) The racing dates for KSDF and KSBIF stakes shall be issued after the track has established its race dates.

Section 18. Promotions. The KSDF or KSBIF may [shall] provide a trophy for each event, and the program that provides the trophy shall purchase the trophy out of its fund.

Section 19. Nomination Fees.

- (1) After payment of the mare or stallion nomination fee, foals shall remain eligible for events each year by making the required sustaining and declaration payments for that year, as set forth in Section 20. The "KSDF/KSBIF Kentucky Sire Stakes (KYSS) Nomination Form," KHRC 7-040-1, shall be filed with the commission along with the nomination and sustaining fees.
- (2) [(1)] After payment of the <u>yearling</u> nomination fee, foals shall remain eligible for events each year by making the required sustaining and declaration payments for that year, as set forth in Section 20. The "KSDF/KSBIF Kentucky Sire Stakes (KYSS) Nomination Form,"[7] KHRC 7-040-1, shall be filed with the commission along with the nomination and sustaining fees.
- (3) [(2)] The two (2) year old March 15 payment shall be made [in order] to remain eligible to the KSDF and KSBIF as a three (3) year old without penalty, except as provided in Section 20.
- (4) [(3)] Nomination and sustaining payments shall be made to the KSDF and KSBIF in U.S. funds by a money order or a check drawn on a U.S. bank account.

Section 20. Nomination Schedule.

- (1) Mares or Stallions shall be nominated by December 31 of the year of conception of the horse sought to be eligible by submitting a completed "KSDF/KSBF Stallion Certificate of Eligibility Form," KHRC 7-040-2, or "KSDF/KSBF Mare Certificate of Eligibility Form," KHRC 7-040-3. The nomination fee shall be set forth in KHRC 7-040-2 or 7-040-3, except as provided in subsection (4) of this section.
 - [(1) Yearlings shall be nominated by May 15 of their yearling year, except as provided in subsection (4) of this section.]
- (2) For yearlings sired by a standardbred stallion or mare that resided in Kentucky during the year of conception for a period no less than 180 days [residing in Kentucky] and registered with the KSDF and KSBIF, the nomination fee shall be set forth in the "KSDF/KSBIF Kentucky Sire Stakes (KYSS) Nomination Form," KHRC 7-040-1, except as provided in subsection (5) of this section [forty (40) dollars per yearling]. [For yearlings sired by a standardbred stallion not residing in Kentucky, the nomination fee shall be eighty (80) dollars per yearling.]
- (3) Nominated horses shall be registered with the USTA, Standardbred Canada, or other appropriate international harness racing governing agency and shall be properly identified to the satisfaction of the commission at the time of the nomination. Identification shall be determined by the official registration maintained by the USTA, Standardbred Canada, or other appropriate international harness racing governing agency.
- (4) If a mare is not nominated to the KSDF and KSBIF by December 31 of the year of conception, the mare shall be nominated by submitting a "Late KSDF/KSBIF Mare Certificate of Eligibility Form," KHRC 7-040-4, and paying a penalty as set forth in KHRC 7-040-4.
- (5) [(4)] If a horse sired by a standardbred stallion or mare that resided in Kentucky during the year of conception, for a period no less than 180 days, and registered with the KSDF and KSBIF is not nominated during its yearling year, the horse may be nominated by March 15 of its two (2) year old year by

submitting the "KSDF/KSBIF Kentucky Sire Stakes (KYSS) Nomination Form," KHRC 7-040-1, and paying a penalty as set forth in KHRC 7-040-1.

[(a) For horses sired by a standardbred stallion residing in Kentucky and registered with the KSDF and KSBIF, a nomination fee of \$500 is made by March 15 of the horse's two (2) year old year, along with the sustaining payment required by subsection (5)(a) of this section; or

(b) For horses sired by a standardbred stallion not residing in Kentucky, a nomination fee of \$600 is made by March 15 of the horse's two (2) year old year, along with the sustaining payment required by subsection (5)(a) of this section.]

(6) For three (3) year old horses that fail to make the mandatory March 15 two (2) year old sustaining payment, the horse may be nominated by February 15 of its three (3) year old year by submitting a KHRC 7-040-1 and paying a penalty as set forth in KHRC 7-040-1.

[(5) Sustaining payments shall be as follows:

Section 21. Early Closing Events. The commission may provide for separate early closing events for Kentucky-bred horses.

Section 22. Stallion and Breeder awards. The commission may provide for stallion and breeder awards for Kentucky-bred horses.

Section 23. Incorporation by Reference.

- (1) The following material is incorporated by reference:
 - (a) "KSDF/KSBIF Kentucky Sire Stakes (KYSS) Nomination Form", KHRC 7-040-1, 11/2018;

DATE PREFERENCE SYSTEM

The Date System of preference will be used at Churchill Downs as described below:

Foal Certificates and digital foal certificates no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Churchill Downs; however, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse tattooed.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses in over-filled races.

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot, however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- **2.** All horses intended for racing at Churchill Downs will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:
- 3. **FOR A ZERO DATE** foal papers and digital foal papers must be turned in to the identifier by Saturday, April 29, 2023.

E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a) The day on which a horse's foal papers or digital foal papers are submitted to the identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting). An unnamed horse will not receive an E-date.
- b) The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers or digital foal papers are not on file with the identifier.

To qualify for the latter E-date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Churchill Downs. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches.

- 4. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers or digital papers are removed from the identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another race track will forfeit any date they may have at Churchill Downs.
- 5. Preference dates will consist of two categories: Dirt (D) and Turf (T). Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance.
- 6. A horse that runs in a race, which has been taken off the turf will retain its turf date. A scratched horse will receive an R-date from the date scratched.
- 7. When a race is taken off the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will receive an R-Date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will retain their previous date and will not be permitted to start.
- 8. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.
- 9. A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list.
- 10. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a cancelled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.

- 11. The draw of stakes and handicap race is not subject to date preference.
- 12. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's office.
- 13. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- 14. Winners will be preferred in all non maiden races.

CONDITION PREFERENCE

Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded Stakes winners (Grade I-II-III), providing the horse has finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th for \$40,000 or more since starting for less than \$40,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$25,000 will not be preferred.

WINNERS ARE PREFERRED IN ALL NON-MAIDEN RACES.

Also-Eligibles

If there are any scratches in a race with also-eligibles, the also-eligible horses will be permitted to move into the race in the order listed on the overnight.

810 KAR 4:010. HORSES

The stewards may at any time require presentation of a horse's registration certificate, virtual certificate, or racing permit or other proof of ownership.

Upon claim, sale or any other transfer of ownership, the horse's registration certificate or racing permit shall be given to the new owner, and any virtual certificate shall be transferred to the new owner electronically. The new owner shall report the change in ownership to the stewards.

SANDY RIGDE at THE RED MILE PREFERENCE POLICY for the 2023 spring meet

Below is the preference policy of the meet as approved by the AQHA, KY-QHA and published in the meet Rules of Racing.

- 1. Horses that enter and are in the body of a race will receive an **R date** corresponding to the day of the meet they race and lose any date previously held. This excludes stakes, handicap stakes, and trials.
- 2. Horses which scratch or are scratched will be assigned an **R** date as if they had run.
- 3. A horse placed on the steward, starter, or vets list will lose their date and be assigned an **R date** corresponding to the day of the meet they are removed from the list.
- 4. Horses which have established a date will lose said date should their papers be withdrawn from the Racing Office or demonstrate intent to race elsewhere. Should papers be removed from the Racing Office for just cause (i.e. Tattoo, etc.) the Racing Secretary may determine the status of preference date established.
- 5. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a cancelled race will retain their previous date.
- 6. In no way does the transfer of ownership or trainer transfer affect a horse's preference date.
- 7. When a horse name appears in the body of a race, other than a stakes or trial race, and is entered on a following day, such entry will receive no consideration should the race be over-filled.

KEENELAND DATE PREFERENCE SYSTEM

The Date System of preference will be used at Keeneland Association as described below:

Foal Certificates and Digital Foal Certificates are no longer required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Keeneland Association; however, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse tattooed.

TO RECEIVE Λ ZERO (O) DATE, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file with the Horse Identifier by Monday, Λ pril 3, 2023.

Preference by condition eligibility then by:

- In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot, however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- All horses intended for racing at Keeneland Association will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:

E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a. The day on which a horse's foal papers/digital foal papers and name rag are submitted to the identifier (the carliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting).
- b. 'The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the identifier.
- c. To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a. The day of a horse's most recent race at Keeneland Association.
- An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches (provided the foal papers are on file with the identifier).
- 3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers or digital papers are removed from the identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Keeneland Association.
- Preference dates will consist of two categories: Dirt (D) and Turf (1). Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance.
- A horse that runs in a race, which has been taken off the Turf will retain its Turf date and establish a Dirt R-Date. A scratched horse will receive an R-Date from the date scratched for both Turf and Dirt.
- When a race is taken off the Turf, Main Track Only (MTO) horses will receive an R-Date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the Turf, MTO horses will retain their previous dare.
- Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races in order listed. A horse entered as MTO
 shall be listed as an Also-Eligible. If the race remains on the Turf, a horse listed as MTO shall not be
 permitted to draw into the race.
- 8. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.
- A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list.
- A horse which is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
- 11. Stakes and handicap races are not subject to date preference.

- 12. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- 13. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- 14. Winners will be preferred in all non-maiden races.

Condition Preference

- Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded stake
 winners (Grade I-II-III), open stakes winners through their allowance conditions providing the horse has
 finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th for \$40,000 or more since starting for less than \$40,000. In
 allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter
 races for less than \$25,000 will not be preferred.
- No entry will be received except upon the condition that all disputes, claims and objections arising out of
 the racing or with respect to the interpretation of the conditions of any race shall be decided by the
 officers of the association, or those whom they may appoint and their decision upon all points shall be
 final
- No entry shall be accepted from any stable not provided with a trainer's license.

Main Track Only Entries

- Entries will be accepted in turf races (excluding stakes) for Main Track Only (MTO) horses.
- Trainers must declare the horse as MTO at the time of entry.
- A horse entered as MTO shall be listed as Also-Eligible.
- In an over-filled turf race, Keeneland reserves the right to designate two Main Track Only (MTO)
 positions on the Also-Eligible List. Also-Eligibles (including MTO) shall be assigned a post position by
 preference. If preference is equal, post positions shall be drawn by lot, unless otherwise stipulated in the
 published conditions of the race.
- If the race remains on the turf, a horse listed as MTO shall not be permitted to draw into the race. When a race is removed from the turf, MTO horses will lose any date they have if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the turf, MTO horses will retain their previous date.



The General Fund line includes amounts that are deposited to various accounts. These caps are calculated from deposits resulting from the excise tax for conducting pair-instant wagering on fistorical horse raping. Since these amounts are calculated as a whole and hot per ficiented, a one-time transfer will be made once the caps are met within the fiscal year. At the end of the fiscal year, approximately \$2M must be deducted from this line in order to determine the actual amount retained by the General Fund.
