

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has received the attached request from Richard Riedel seeking transfer of funds from the unclaimed pari-mutuel tickets to the Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund. This total amount is \$711,548 less any claims and advertising.

The following documents are enclosed:

- Letter from Richard Riedel seeking transfer of funds;
- Chart reflecting dollars due the fund:
- Chart reflecting dollars paid to fund;
- Approval of the release of funds from the Kentucky State Auditor; and
- Copy of the Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund audit report for 2020 prepared by Monroe Shine.

Pursuant, to KRS 230.362, any reported pari-mutuel ticket that has not been claimed within one (1) year from the time the ticket became payable is presumed to be abandoned. Each year, any person or association holding any unclaimed tickets presumed abandoned as of July 1<sup>st</sup> of that year (in other words, any person holding on July 1<sup>st</sup> any tickets that have not, as of that date, been claimed for a year or more) is required to create a list of the tickets. The list, which records the amount of each ticket, is then submitted to the Commission by September 1<sup>st</sup> of the same year. Between November 1<sup>st</sup> and November 15<sup>th</sup>, the person or association then turns over to the Commission the sum represented by the tickets as reported.

The tickets turned over to the Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund are over a year old. Specifically, these are tickets that were originally sold to bettors between July 1, 2019, and June 30, 2020, and were still unclaimed a year (or more) later on July 1, 2021. Below is a copy of the statute regarding payments to the Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc.



## 230.374 Payments to Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc.

All sums reported and paid to the authority under the provisions of KRS 230.361 to

230.373, with the exception of funds paid under KRS 230.398, shall be paid by the

authority to the Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc., a nonprofit charitable corporation, organized for the benefit, aid, assistance, and relief of thoroughbred owners, trainers, jockeys, valets, exercise riders, grooms, stable attendants, pari-mutuel clerks, and other thoroughbred racing personnel employed in connection with racing, and their spouses and children, who can demonstrate their need for financial assistance connected with death, illness, or off-the-job injury and are not otherwise covered by union health and welfare plans, workers' compensation, Social Security, public welfare, or any type of health, medical, death, or accident insurance. These sums shall be paid on or before December 31 in each year, however, no payments shall be made by the authority to the Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc., unless the authority and the Auditor of Public Accounts are satisfied that the fund is in all respects being operated for the charitable and benevolent purposes as set forth in this section and that no part of the funds paid to the fund by the authority or any net earnings of the fund inure to the benefit of any private individual, director, officer, or member of the fund or any of the persons who turned over sums to the authority representing unclaimed pari-mutuel tickets.

The following is a brief description of the fund for informational purposes.

Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund. The Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc. is an independent charitable corporation, organized for the benefit, aid, assistance and relief of thoroughbred owners, trainers, jockeys, valets, exercise riders, grooms, stable attendants, pari-mutuel clerks and other thoroughbred racing personnel employed in connection with racing, and their spouses and children, who can demonstrate their need for financial assistance connected with death, illness or off-the-job injury and are not otherwise covered by union health and welfare plans, workers' compensation, Social Security, public welfare or any type of health, medical, death or accident insurance. Proceeds from unclaimed parimutuel tickets provide the revenue for this fund.

### Independent Auditor's Report

Board of Directors Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc. Louisville, Kentucky

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc., which comprise the statements of net assets – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2020 and 2019, and the related statements of revenues, expenses and other changes in net assets – modified cash basis and functional expenses – modified cash basis for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

## Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 1; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statement in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

### Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audits. We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the linancial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. ## (1) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## Nature of Operations

The Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund, Inc., (Fund) a non-profit charitable corporation, was formed in 1978 pursuant to KRS 230.374.

The Fund is organized for the benefit, aid, assistance and relief of owners, trainers, jockeys, valets, exercise riders, grooms, stable attendants, pari-mutuel clerks and other racing personnel employed in connection with thoroughbred racing and their spouses and children who demonstrate need for financial assistance connected with death, illness, off-the-job injury and are not otherwise covered by union health and welfare plans, workers' compensation, social security, public welfare or any type of health, medical, death or accident insurance.

Pursuant to KRS 230.374 the Fund receives an annual grant which represents uncashed thoroughbred pari-mutuel tickets. No payment is made to the Fund unless the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission and the Kentucky Auditor of Public Accounts are satisfied the Fund is, in all respects, operated for the charitable and benevotent purposes set forth in KRS 230.374 and 230.375 and no part of the grant paid to the Fund or any net earnings of the Fund inure to the benefit of any individual, director, officer, member of the Fund, or persons who turned over sums to the Commission representing unclaimed pari-mutuel tickets. These payments are restricted by law and are only available for use as set forth in KRS 230.374 and 230.375.

The Fund sponsors the Kentucky Race Track Retirement Plan. The Plan, with discretionary contributions, was established pursuant to KRS 230.375 and is administered for the benefit of eligible participants.

#### **Basis of Presentation**

These financial statements are presented on the modified cash basis of accounting, another comprehensive basis of accounting. The modified cash basis of accounting incorporates elements of both the cash basis of accounting and generally-accepted accounting principles (GAAP). Consequently, revenues are recognized when received and certain expenses and purchases of assets are recognized when cash is disbursed. Depreciation of property and equipment is reported in the financial statements.

The primary differences between the Fund's modified cash basis of accounting and GAAP relates to the recognition of liabilities for claims incurred in one year and paid in the next and disclosure of expenses by natural and functional classification. GAAP would recognize the liability and expense when incurred whereas the modified cash basis recognizes the expense when paid. Management has concluded determining the amount of these claims and the associated expense is an undue administrative burden, speculative and would provide minimal additional financial information.

Management has concluded the modified cash basis of accounting provides an accurate reflection of the Fund's economic activity and operations, accommodates the preparation of operating budgets, internal and external financial statements and facilitates the comparison of budgets to financial statements.

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board which requires the Fund to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets: net assets with donor restrictions and net assets without donor restrictions.

Certain prior year accounts have been reclassified to conform with current year presentations.

## Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Fund considers all cash accounts, which are not subject to withdrawal restrictions or penalties, and all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity date of three months or less to be cash and cash equivalents in the financial statements.

#### Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values are measured at fair market value in the statement of net assets. The unrealized gains or losses on investments are included in the change in net assets. Gains and losses on the marketable securities are determined based upon the specific securities sold.

## Mortgage Notes Receivable

Mortgage notes receivable are carried at their estimated collectable amounts. Interest income on mortgage notes receivable is recognized using the cash method. Interest income on impaired loans is recognized as cash is collected or on a cost-recovery basis. Provisions for losses on mortgage notes receivable are determined on the basis of loss experience, known and inherent risks, the estimated value of underlying collateral, and current economic conditions.

#### Concentration of Credit Risk

The Fund maintains its cash at financial institutions and at times the balances may be in excess of federally insured limits. At December 31, 2020, the Fund had \$14,201 of funds in excess of insured limits.

## Use of Estimates

The Fund uses estimates and assumptions in preparing these financial statements in accordance with its modified cash basis of accounting. These estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and the reported expenses, primarily the capitalization and depreciation of long-lived assets. Actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

## Change in Accounting Principle

On January 1, 2019, the Fund adopted Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2014-09, Revenue from Contracts with Customers (Topic 606), (ASU 2014-09) and FASB ASU 2018-08, Not-For-Profit Entities (Topic 958): Clarifying the Scope and the Accounting Guidance for Contributions Received and Contributions Made (ASU 2018-08).

### (1 - continued)

These two ASUs were adopted together as of January 1, 2019, because they both establish standards for characterizing grants and similar contracts with resource providers as either exchange transactions or conditional contributions. ASU 2014-09 was adopted retrospectively only to agreements that were not completed at January 1, 2019. ASU 2018-08 was applied on a modified prospective basis to agreements that were not completed January 1, 2019, or that were entered into after that date. The adoption did not have a material impact on the timing of revenue recognition as of the adoption date and did not result in a cumulative effect adjustment to net assets.

### **Expense Allocation**

Directly identifiable expenses are charged to programs and supporting services. Expenses related to more than one function are charged to programs and supporting services on the basis of periodic time and expense studies. Management and general expenses include those expenses that are not directly identifiable with any other specific function but provide for the overall support and direction of the Foundation.

### Income Taxes

The Fund is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Accordingly, the financial statements do not provide for income taxes.

The Fund has implemented the accounting guidance for uncertainty in income taxes. Under that guidance, tax positions need to be recognized in the financial statements when it is more-likely-than-not the position will be sustained upon examination by the tax authorities. As of December 31, 2020, the Fund has no uncertain tax positions that qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Fund files a federal Form 990. The Fund is not currently being examined and management believes its tax-exempt status would be upheld under examination.

### (2) LIQUIDITY

The organization's financial assets available within one year of the balance sheet date for general expenditure are as follows:

As part of the Organization's liquidity management, it has a policy to structure its financial assets to be available as its general expenditures, liabilities, and other obligations come due. In addition, the Organization invests cash in excess of daily requirements in short-term investments such as marketable securities.

The Fund holds the above securities, invested in a designated operating reserve account, to ensure its ability to continue operations as set forth in KRS 230.374 and 230.375. In recent years, the Fund's annual budgeted expenditures have exceeded the grants received from uncashed pari-mutuel tickets. The Fund's board of directors and management consider this operating reserve and the related income generated, necessary to continue the operations of the Fund. The operating reserve investment helps management continue to provide health and welfare benefits despite the uncertainty about the amounts and timing of the grants received and benefits provided.

### (4) FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Fund adopted the provisions of ASC 820 Fair Value Measurements, for financial assets and financial liabilities. The Fund has no nonfinancial assets and nonfinancial liabilities determined at fair value.

ASC 820 defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. ASC 820 establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the use of inputs used in valuation methodologies into the following three levels:

(4 - continued)

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices, unadjusted for identical assets or liabilities in active markets. A quoted market price in an active market provides the most reliable evidence of fair value and shall be used to measure fair value whenever available.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted market prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active; or inputs to the valuation methodology that are derived principally from or can be corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Level 3 assets and liabilities include financial instruments whose value is determined using discounted cash flow methodologies, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

A description of the valuation methodology used for instruments measured at fair value, as well as the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy, is set forth below. The table below presents the balance of the assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2020 and 2019.

Marketable securities. Marketable securities are reported at fair value on a recurring basis. These securities are classified as Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy where quoted market prices from reputable third-party brokers are available in an active market. If quoted market prices are not available, the Fund obtains fair value measurements from independent pricing services. The Company's valuation methodologies may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. While management believes the Company's valuation methodologies are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different estimate of fair value at the reporting date.

### (5) RELATED PARTY MORTGAGE NOTES AND ADVANCES

The Fund advanced cash to The Old School, LLC and Back Track, Inc. These entities are related parties with members common to both boards of directors. The advances were for operations, the purchase and renovation of a building, and payment of professional fees. At December 31, 2020 and 2019, unpaid advances to The Old School, LLC amounted to \$1,889,546. At December 31, 2020 and 2019, unpaid advances to Back Track, Inc. amounted to \$15,275 and \$4,505, respectively.

### (6) OPERATING LEASE AND SUBLEASE

The Fund leases office space from The Old School, LLC. The initial term of the lease expired during 2019 and was extended through October 1, 2020 with fourteen additional one year renewal options.

### (6 - continued)

Rent paid under the lease amounted to \$5,976 per month during the years ended December 31, 2020 and 2019. The lease agreement also contains a provision which requires the Fund to reimburse The Old School, LLC for its share of certain expenses. Total rent expense for the years ended December 31, 2020 and 2019 was \$71,710. For the years ended December 31, 2020 and 2019, \$35,855 was allocated to the Kentucky Racing Health Services Center and \$35,855 was reported as an administrative cost.

The Fund uses a portion of the leased space for its offices and subleases the remaining space. Rent received under this sublease for the years ended December 31, 2020 and 2019 was \$2,925 and \$5,200, respectively.

### (7) KENTUCKY RACE TRACK RETIREMENT PLAN

The Kentucky Race Track Retirement Plan is funded with discretionary contributions from the Fund. Contributions to the Plan were \$62,500 and \$250,000 for the years ended December 31, 2020 and 2019, respectively. The Fund also paid related administration expenses for the Plan of \$8,833 and \$7,911 for the years ended December 31, 2020 and 2019, respectively.

### (8) EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT PLAN

The Fund has a simplified employee retirement plan for all full time employees with over three years of service. The Fund's contribution equals 8% of the participant's compensation. The Fund's contributions to the plan amounted to \$20,295 and \$19,387 for the years ended December 31, 2020 and 2019, respectively.

### (9) DEVELOPER FEE RECEIVABLE

In 2002, the Fund entered into a development agreement with The Old School, LLC to supervise the rehabilitation of the building owned by The Old School, LLC. The development agreement required The Old School, LLC to pay the Fund a development fee in the amount of \$743,681. The remaining unpaid balance of \$320,252 is evidenced by an unsecured note payable to the Fund. This note carries an interest rate of 6.0% and is due November 1, 2032 with interest.

### (10) PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM LOAN

The Fund received \$71,000 in funding through a loan under the Small Business Administration's Paycheck Protection Program in April 2020. This unsecured loan had a maturity of two years and an interest rate of 1%. The Fund accounted for the amount as a loan and will recognize income when formally forgiven which occurred on March 16, 2021.

### (11) SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In preparing these financial statements, the Fund has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements and related notes thereto have taken place through June 15, 2021.

The Fund received grants of uncashed pari-mutuel tickets totaling \$1,957,985 in January of 2021.

**PROGRAM** 

The Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund/Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund Advisory Panel met on September 24, 2021 and recommends approval for the following 2022 Kentucky Sire Stakes estimated purse distributions:

Two-and-Three-Year-Old:

**Legs:** \$80,000 **Finals:** \$400,000

In addition to the purses above, the Advisory Panel recommends early closing events (Commonwealth Series A and B) with the following purse distributions:

COMMONWEALTH A COMMONWEALTH B
Two-and-Three-Year-Old: Two-and-Three-Year-Old

Legs: \$30,000 Legs: \$15,000 Finals: \$50,000

The above three series will be raced at the Red Mile, beginning July 31, 2022 and concluding with the Championship races on September 18, 2022 for the KYSS Series, September 19, 2022 for the Commonwealth A Series and September 20, 2022 for the Commonwealth B series.

The Panel also recommends early closers mini-series with the following purse distributions:

Oak Grove: ECL at Corbin:

Two-and-Three-Year-Old:Maturity SeriesLegs (2): \$25,000Leg (1): \$35,000Final: \$100,000Final: \$70,000

Consolation: \$25,000

Four-Year-Old:

Legs (4): \$50,000; Final: \$150,000



### **New Development Fund Program: 50% KSDF Bonus**

Contingent upon a statutory amendment of KRS 230.770(4), the Panel recommends allocating up to \$2,000,000 to establish a new development fund program, which would be structured similarly to the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund ("KTDF"). Specifically, the program would allow Kentucky racetracks to place funds in overnight races that include both Kentucky-bred and non-Kentucky-bred Standardbred horses.

### **Kentucky Proud Series**

As in the past, the Panel will continue to support harness racing at county fairs through the Kentucky Proud Series by providing up to eight events and a Final with purses of \$1,500 per starter, per division for each event and \$50,000 for the Finals.

### **Kentucky Sire Stakes Description**

The following is a brief description of the KYSS and funding for informational purposes:

The Kentucky Sire Stakes is a culmination of a month-long series of preliminary races, with the biggest money earners getting a chance to compete in the finals at The Red Mile. The series includes two-and-three-year-old pacers and trotters for both fillies & colts.

### **Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund (KSDF):**

This fund is to promote races and to provide purses for races for Kentucky-bred Standardbred horses. The fund is to be distributed to persons, corporations, or associations operating licensed Standardbred race tracks within Kentucky on an equitable basis, for the purposes of conducting separate races for two and three-year-old fillies and colts, both trotting and pacing. The KSDF receives its revenue under the provisions of KRS 138.510, taxes on pari-mutuel wagering.

### **Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund (KSBIF):**

The Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund is financed from the 13% of all receipts collected from the sales and use tax on the fees paid for breeding a stallion to a mare in Kentucky, together with any other money contributed, appropriated, or allocated to the fund from all other sources. The money deposited in the KSBIF is used to provide rewards for breeders or owners of Kentucky-bred Standardbred horses.

In addition to the uncashed ticket money, the KSDF/KSBIF Advisory Panel recommends continuing to support harness racing at KY County Fairs through the KY Proud Series by providing up to eight events and a Final with purses of \$1,500 per entry, per division, with a minimum purse of \$6,000 per division, for each event and a Finals purse of \$50,000.

The Panel recommends the following dates and conditions for 2022:

- Saturday, May 28, 2022: Purchase District Fair (Mayfield/Graves County)
- Saturday, June 4, 2022: LaCenter (Ballard County Fair)
- Sunday, June 12, 2022/Monday, June 13, 2022: Oak Grove (Christian County Fair)
- Sunday, June 19, 2022: Lebanon (Woodford County Fair)
- Wednesday, June 29, 2022: Lebanon (Marion County Fair)
- Wednesday, July 6, 2022: Lebanon (Washington County Fair)
- Wednesday, July 13, 2022: Red Mile (Mercer County Fair)
- Saturday, July 23, 2022: Red Mile (Finals)

In addition to the purses and race dates, the following conditions are recommended:

**Minimum Number of Starts:** a horse must have started in at least one-half (50%) of the Kentucky Proud Series to be eligible to race in the Kentucky Proud Series Final.



**Number of Starters and Purse Distributions:** There shall be no more than two (2) trailers in any race.

- On a one (1) mile track, there shall be ten (10) horses on the gate and the race shall split on eleven (11) horses.
- On a half-mile track there shall be five (5) horses on the gate with two (2) trailers, and the race shall split on eight (8) horses.
- On a five-eights mile track, there shall be eight (8) horses on the gate and the race shall split on nine (9) horses.

Fees to Participate in 2022: Paid to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission except when noted.

- 1. A nomination fee of fifty (\$50) dollars per horse due on or before February 15, 2022;
- 2. A sustaining fee of \$200 per horse due on or before April 15, 2022;

Approval is recommended.

- 3. A starting fee of fifty (\$50) dollars per horse, per race, due at the time of entry paid to the Fair; and
- 4. A \$200 payment shall be due at the time of entry for a horse eligible for the finals.

In order to avoid a horse receiving claim money from more than one (1) Kentucky affiliate participating in the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund, KHRC Deputy Executive Director Jamie Eads, recommends that the Commission vote to amend 810 KAR 7:050, Section 2(14)(c), and the accompanying form, to require that each horse shall receive claim money from only one (1) Kentucky affiliate per year.

- NECESSITY, FUNCTION AND CONFORMITY: KRS. 230.804 establishes the Kentucky Horse
  Breeders' Incentive Fund. KRS 230.804(2)(b) requires the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission to
  promulgate administrative regulations establishing the conditions and criteria for the distribution
  of moneys from the fund. This administrative regulation establishes eligibility standards,
  administrative practices to enforce the standards, and the procedures for paying incentive
  awards from the fund.
- 13 Section 1. Definitions.

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- (1) "Applicant" means a Kentucky affiliate representing a breed of horses which is eligible to register with the commission to participate in the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund.
  - (2) "Award distribution plan" means a plan submitted by a Kentucky affiliate to the commission outlining the procedures by which the Kentucky affiliate will award funds from the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund to incentive winners who are members of the Kentucky affiliate.

- (3) "Breed" means a subspecies of horse with particular physical characteristics common to
   the subspecies which are used in establishing the identity of a horse by a registry recognized by
   the commission.
- 4 (4) "Breeder" means:

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- (a) A person or persons engaged in the breeding of horses eligible for the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund, as defined by the national association of the Kentucky affiliate recognized by the commission as a participant in the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund program; or
- (b) If the national association does not define "breeder", the owner of the dam of a horse when the horse was foaled.
- (5) "Closed breed registry" means the restrictions of the official national breed registry recognized by the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund.
- (6) "Contest" means a competitive event with an outcome which qualifies the owner of a horse as an incentive winner under a Kentucky affiliate's award distribution plan.
- 15 (7) "Incentive winner" means a person whose horse's performance in a contest entitles that

  16 person to an award from the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund.
  - (8) "Kentucky affiliate" means the Kentucky organization that is recognized by a national breed organization representing that particular breed of horse in Kentucky.
  - (9) "Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund" means the trust and revolving fund established by KRS 230.804.
- 21 (10) "KHBIF" means the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund.
  - (11) "Show horse" means a horse that participates in judged exhibition competitions.

Section 2. Registration of Kentucky Affiliate.

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- 2 (1) Only a Kentucky affiliate may register to participate in the KHBIF.
- 3 (2) Kentucky affiliates shall have an Internal Revenue Service 501(c) designation.
- 4 (3) To become eligible to receive funds from the KHBIF, a Kentucky affiliate shall register 5 with the commission by:
- 6 (a) Filing an "Application for Registration of Kentucky Affiliate with the Kentucky Horse
  7 Breeders' Incentive Fund", KHRC Form HB-1, (12/08); and
- (b) Filing with the application an award distribution plan to be reviewed and approved by thecommission.
  - (4) A thoroughbred breed shall not be eligible for registration with the KHBIF, unless the thoroughbred breed consists exclusively of show horses.
  - (5) A standardbred breed shall not be eligible for registration with the KHBIF, unless the standardbred breed consists exclusively of show horses.
  - (6) The color of a breed of horses shall not be the sole criterion used to define that breed for purposes of registration with the KHBIF.
  - (7) The commission may establish, under its general jurisdiction, the KHBIF Advisory Committee (the "advisory committee"). If established, the advisory committee shall consist of three (3) members appointed by the chairman of the commission by July 1 of each year. One (1) member shall be recommended to the chairman for appointment by the Kentucky Equine Education Project (KEEP). If KEEP has not recommended a member for appointment by July 1 of a given year, the Chairman of the commission shall make the appointment without the recommendation. At least one (1) member of the advisory committee shall have established

- knowledge of gaited horses. Each member of the advisory committee shall serve from July 1 through June 30 of the following year. Each member of the advisory committee shall be a resident of Kentucky. Each member of the advisory committee shall serve without compensation, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for all reasonable expenses incurred in the discharge of official business. The advisory committee shall select a chairman from its
  - (8)(a) The advisory committee shall advise and assist the commission in the registration process described in this section. The advisory committee shall make a recommendation of approval or denial to the commission for each applicant based upon the application and compliance with the requirements established in subsection (13) of this section.
  - (b) The commission shall employ qualified personnel necessary to assist the commission and the advisory committee in carrying out the provisions of this administrative regulation. These personnel shall serve at the pleasure of the commission, and compensation for these personnel shall be fixed by the commission.
  - (9) After the advisory committee recommends to the commission the approval or denial of an application, the commission shall consider the recommendation and whether or not the requirements of this administrative regulation have been met, and shall:
    - (a) Approve the application;
- (b) Deny the application; or

20 (c) Defer consideration of the application for a reasonable time for the purpose of conducting further investigation of the application.

- (10) Registration shall be effective for three (3) years. The first three (3) year registration period shall consist of the period beginning January 1, 2022, and ending December 31, 2024.
  - (11) For the first registration period, a Kentucky affiliate shall register with the commission on or prior to November 1, 2021. Any Kentucky affiliate that registered with the commission under any previously effective version of this administrative regulation shall reregister.
  - (12) For each three (3) year period beginning on or after January 1, 2022, a Kentucky affiliate shall register with the commission on or prior to November 1 of the calendar year immediately preceding January 1 of the first year of the three (3) year registration period.
  - (13) A Kentucky affiliate shall have until December 31 following the November 1 deadline established in subsections (11) and (12) of this section to revise and update any information previously provided to the commission on or before the November 1 deadline.
  - (14) The application and the accompanying award distribution plan provided to the commission shall include the following information:
    - (a) The name of the breed of horse covered by the plan;
    - (b) The name of the Kentucky affiliate;

(c) A letter from the national breed organization representing the breed certifying that the Kentucky affiliate is the recognized representative in Kentucky of that breed, and certifying the number of horses twenty-five (25) years of age and younger in the breed residing in Kentucky. If the Kentucky affiliate is the national breed organization, then an independent third party approved by the commission shall certify the number of horses. Optionally, if the Kentucky affiliate demonstrates to the commission that it is unable to obtain an independent third party

- to certify horse numbers as required in this subsection, the commission may certify horse numbers at a fee of \$120.00 per hour.
- 1. For a horse to be included in the certification, the horse shall be the result of parentage verified by DNA verification of either the horse's sire or dam. A three (3) generation pedigree on one (1) side shall be displayed on the certificate of registration, so that the horse, at least one (1) of the horse's parents, and at least (1) set of the horse's grandparents are displayed on the certificate.
- 2. Each horse shall <u>receive claim money from</u> [be registered with] only one (1) Kentucky
  affiliate per year.
- 3. The affiliate shall provide the data electronically to the commission and in a format agreeable to the commission;

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- (d) A letter from the national breed organization representing the breed certifying that the breed has a closed breed registry; and
- (e) The award distribution plan pursuant to which awards will be distributed to KHBIF incentive winners who are breeders or owners of horses bred and foaled in Kentucky. The award distribution plan shall specify:
- 1. The scoring method or point system to be utilized in contests to determine the incentive winner of each contest as certified by the national breed organization;
- 2. The identity of the scoring person or body that will judge each contest as certified by the national breed organization;
  - 3. The rules of the contests in which the horses of the breed will participate as certified by the national breed organization; and

- 4. The percentage distribution formula by which the Kentucky affiliate shall grant awards to incentive winners.
- (15)(a) The commission shall be recognized and designated as the sole official registrar of the KHBIF for the purposes of registering the application and award distribution plan for each breed in accordance with the terms of this administrative regulation.
  - (b) The records of each national breed organization shall be used as the official records of the commission for determining the following information:
    - 1. The identity of the Kentucky affiliate representing the breed in Kentucky; and
  - 2. The number of horses of the breed twenty-five (25) years of age and younger registered with the national breed organization and currently residing in Kentucky.
  - (16) If the information on an application form required under this section is found to be inaccurate, or becomes inaccurate, or changes, the organization identified as the Kentucky affiliate shall promptly notify the commission of the correct information within thirty (30) days of discovering the inaccuracy or the circumstances causing the information to become inaccurate or to change.
    - Section 3. Timing and Distribution of Awards.

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- 17 (1) The events eligible for awards from the KHBIF, as set forth in each award distribution 18 plan, shall be those occurring on or after January 1, 2006.
- 19 (2) Awards to incentive winners shall be calculated and distributed each year.
- 20 (3) The commission, with the cooperation of each Kentucky affiliate shall, after the end of 21 each calendar year, calculate the funds due to each Kentucky affiliate for that year.

(4) The amount allocated to a Kentucky affiliate participating in the KHBIF shall be calculated
 by:

- (a) Dividing the number of horses of the breed twenty-five (25) years of age and younger and currently residing in Kentucky as certified by the national breed organization pursuant to Section 2(14)(c) of this administrative regulation, by the total number of horses from all Kentucky affiliates certified pursuant to Section 2(14)(c) of this administrative regulation. The number of horses in each case shall be the number of horses recorded on each Kentucky affiliate's application form on the December 31 deadline established in Section 2(13) of this administrative regulation; and
- (b) Multiplying the fraction obtained in paragraph (a) by the total amount of money allocated to all Kentucky affiliates during the year.
- (5) An award to an incentive winner from the KHBIF shall be determined based on the award distribution plan submitted by the Kentucky affiliate representing the breed to the commission pursuant to Section 2(2)(b) of this administrative regulation.
- (6) The commission shall, by March 1 of each year, notify the Kentucky affiliate of the total dollars allocated to that affiliate.
- (7) Kentucky affiliate shall, by October 1 of each year, notify the commission of the names of the incentive winners who are entitled to awards for contests held during the previous year. The Kentucky affiliate shall also, by October 1 of each year, notify the commission of the names of the horses registered to that affiliate, and the date of each horse's registration. If a horse is registered with more than one (1) affiliate, the commission shall not count that horse's award, and the funds for that award shall revert back to the KHBIF to be distributed in future awards.

- (a) Within thirty (30) calendar days of receiving the names of the incentive winners from the Kentucky affiliate, the commission shall generate claim forms for the appropriate Kentucky affiliate.
  - (b) The Kentucky affiliate shall provide the claim forms received from the commission to its incentive winners from the previous year.

- (c) The Kentucky affiliate shall provide a letter to the commission, which certifies that it has notified all incentive winners of their awards from the previous year. The commission shall not issue an award check for any of that Kentucky affiliate's incentive winners prior to receiving this letter.
- (8) After receiving notification of an award, each incentive winner shall return an enclosed claim form for the award that certifies that the incentive winner is entitled to the award and that certifies the incentive winner's taxpayer ID number or Social Security number. The claim form shall be delivered to the commission no later than December 31 of the same year in which the commission notified the incentive winner of the award pursuant to subsection (7) of this section.
- (9) The claim form shall be the form "Claim Form of Incentive Winner for Award from the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund", KHRC Form HB-2, (12/06).
- (10) Failure to return the claim form required by subsection (8) of this section by December 31 of the year in which the incentive winner was notified of the award pursuant to subsection (7) of this section shall result in forfeiture of the award, and the award money shall lapse to the KHBIF.

- 1 (11) An award from the KHBIF shall not be granted to any incentive winner who is not in
- 2 good standing with the national breed organization or Kentucky affiliate.
- 3 Section 4. Semiannual Reports.
- (1) A semiannual status report describing a Kentucky affiliate's progress and participation in the award distribution plan shall be filed with the advisory committee by each Kentucky affiliate on or before July 31 and January 31. If that date is on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday,
- 7 the report shall be due on the first business day thereafter.
- 8 (2) The semiannual report shall also include:
- 9 (a) A list of all stallions presently breeding horses eligible to participate in the fund, and the 10 farm locations on which the stallions stand;
  - (b) A schedule of all state and national contests for that year in which horses eligible to participate in the KHBIF are scheduled to participate;
- 13 (c) A list of all horses registered with the Kentucky affiliate and the horse's date of 14 registration with that affiliate;
  - (d) A current list of the Kentucky affiliate's board members; and
- (e) The current contact information of the Kentucky affiliate's preferred contacts.
- 17 Section 5. Disputes.

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(1) Any dispute between the commission and a Kentucky affiliate or national breed organization arising under this administrative regulation shall be raised by the aggrieved party filing a petition seeking relief with the executive director of the commission, within thirty (30) days of the action or the inaction leading to the dispute, as established in 810 KAR 7:070.

- (2) If the executive director and the aggrieved party do not agree on a resolution of the dispute, the executive director shall assign the case to a hearing officer who shall conduct a hearing pursuant to KRS Chapter 13B.
- 4 Section 6. Disciplinary Procedures.

- 5 (1) Violations, discipline, disputes, and investigation shall take place according to 810 KAR 7:070.
  - (2) In addition to the procedures established in 810 KAR 7:070, and notwithstanding any contrary provisions of 810 KAR 7:070, the commission may take the following actions, which would be subject to appeal as established in 810 KAR 7:070:
  - (a) For a violation of 810 KAR 7:070, the commission may bar a Kentucky affiliate or national breed organization from registering for a period of from one (1) to ten (10) years, based on the seriousness of the violation.
  - (b) For a second or subsequent violation of 810 KAR 7:070, the commission may bar the Kentucky affiliate or national breed organization from eligibility to receive an incentive from the KHBIF for a period of from one (1) to twenty (20) years.
  - (c) If the evidence available to the commission indicates that an individual who is a member of, or acting on behalf of, a Kentucky affiliate or national breed organization has, without the knowledge or consent of the Kentucky affiliate or national breed organization, violated 810 KAR 7:070, then the commission may condition the continuing registration of the Kentucky affiliate in the KHBIF upon the exclusion of that individual from any further participation in work related to the KHBIF.
  - Section 7. Incorporation by Reference.

- 1 (1) The following material is incorporated by reference:

Pursuant to 810 KAR 3:050, a renewal license application for a simulcast facility must be filed no later than November 1 in the year preceding the calendar year for which renewal is requested. On October 20, 2020, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission ("KHRC") voted unanimously to grant Churchill Downs Racetrack, LLC ("Churchill Downs") an initial license for a simulcast facility. Subsequently, Churchill Downs launched this simulcast facility in late Fall 2020. On September 16, 2021, Churchill Downs filed a renewal license application for its simulcast facility located in Louisville, KY, at the Louisville Thoroughbred Society.

The Louisville Thoroughbred Society is a private club owned and operated by Louisville Thoroughbred Society, LLC. Churchill Downs and Keeneland Association, LLC ("Keeneland") are the two thoroughbred racetracks within 75 miles of the facility. Keeneland has provided its consent for Churchill Downs to operate the simulcast facility within the radius prescribed by 810 KAR 3:050. Simulcast offerings at the facility will be identical to those requested by Churchill Downs in its application to conduct live racing and pari-mutuel wagering for the license year 2022.

As per 810 KAR 3:050, a renewal license application for a simulcast must include all information required by 810 KAR 3:050 Section 2. The KHRC staff has reviewed Churchill Downs' submission and believes the requirements prescribed in the aforementioned regulation have been met by the applicant. Therefore, KHRC staff recommends approval of this renewal license application for a simulcast facility.
