**Re:** Proposed amendments to 810 KAR 4:040: Running of the race.

On September 30, 2020, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission approved various suggested changes to the crop rule. That approval led to concerns raised by the Jockey's Guild. In the intervening eight months, meetings were held among Commission members, industry representatives, and legislators to devise a reasonable and safe compromise regulation.

On May 3, 2021, the Rules Committee approved new regulatory amendments to 810 KAR 4:040. The major proposed changes to this regulation are as follows:

- Use of the riding crop will be allowed in the following ways:
  - No more than six (6) times in the overhand fashion;
  - No more than two (2) times in succession;
  - To avoid a dangerous situation or preserve the safety of racing participants and/or horses;
  - If necessary, in a backhanded or underhanded fashion from the 3/8 pole to the finish line, which does not count to the use of the crop six (6) times in the overhand fashion;
  - Tapping the horse on the shoulder in the down position with both hands holding the reins and touching the horse's neck; and
  - Showing or waving the crop without contact to the horse.
- A jockey may never use the crop with his wrist above helmet height.
- Penalties will include:
  - Either a minimum fine of \$500.00 or a minimum suspension of three (3) days.
  - If the violation is egregious or intentional, then the stewards may impose both a fine and a suspension.
  - To determine whether a violation is egregious or intentional, the stewards may consider all factors, including the jockey's history of similar violations, the number of uses over the total and consecutive limits, and use of the crop in the overhand position more than six (6) times.

The KHRC staff and the Rules Committee recommend approval.

Running of the race. 5 RELATES TO: KRS 230.215(2), 230.260(1) 6 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 230.215(2), 230.260(8) 7 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) and 230.260(8) 8 authorize the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission to promulgate administrative regulations 9 prescribing the conditions under which racing shall be conducted in Kentucky. This administrative 10 regulation sets forth the standards and requirements governing the running of a horse race. 11 Section 1. Post Time. Post time for the first race on each racing day shall be approved by 12 the commission. Post time for subsequent races on the same program shall be fixed by the pari-13 mutuels[parimutuels] manager. No race shall start after 11:55 p.m. 14 Section 2. Horses in paddock not to be touched. Only the following persons may touch a 15 horse while in the paddock: 16 (1) Licensed owner; 17 (2) Licensed trainer; 18 (3) Authorized stable personnel; 19 (4) Paddock judge; 20 (5) Horse identifier;

5	Section 3. Trainer Responsibility. The trainer shall be responsible for:

Lead Pony. A horse may be led to the post by a lead pony. Lead ponies may be 10 excluded from the paddock or walking ring, at the discretion of the stewards. Section 8. Control of Horses and Jockeys by Starter. Horses and jockeys shall be under the 11 12 control of the starter from the moment they enter the track until the race is started. 13 (1) The starter may grant a delay if an injury occurs to any jockey or if a jockey's equipment 14 malfunctions. During the delay, the stewards may require all jockeys to dismount. 15 (2) The starter shall unload the horses in the gate when instructed by the stewards if: 16 (a) A horse breaks through the gate or unseats its jockey after any of the field is loaded in 17 the starting gate; and 18 (b) The horse is not immediately taken in hand by the outrider and brought back for 19 reloading. 20 (3) The starter shall reload the horses in their proper order upon order of the stewards. 21 (4) The starter shall report all causes of delay to the stewards. 22 (5) A person other than the jockey, starter, or assistant starter shall not strike a horse or

attempt, by shouting or other means, to assist the horse in getting a start.

- Section 9. Starting Gate. Races on the flat shall use a starting gate approved by the commission unless exempted by the stewards. Exempted races shall not start until the assistant starter has dropped the flag in answer to the starter.
- 4 Section 10. Horses Left at Post.

- (1) If a door at the front of the starting gate fails to open properly and timely when the starter dispatches the field, or if a horse has inadvertently not been loaded in the starting gate when the field is dispatched, thereby causing the horse to be left at the post, the starter shall immediately report the circumstance to the stewards who shall:
- 9 (a) Immediately post the "inquiry" sign;
  - (b) Advise the public to hold all pari-mutuel[parimutuel] tickets; and
  - (c) Determine, after consulting with the starter and viewing the race replay, whether or not the horse was precluded from obtaining a fair start.
  - (2) If the stewards determine that the horse was precluded from obtaining a fair start, the stewards shall rule the horse a nonstarter and shall order money wagered on the horse deducted from the <u>pari-mutuel[parimutuel]</u> pool and refunded to holders of <u>pari-mutuel[parimutuel]</u> tickets on the horse, unless the horse ruled a nonstarter is part of a <u>pari-mutuel[mutuel]</u> entry and another horse in the entry is not left at the post, in which case there shall not be a <u>pari-mutuel[parimutuel]</u> refund.
    - (3) Stakes fees for a ruled nonstarter shall be refunded to the owner.
  - (4) The starter may, in his or her discretion, place an unruly or fractious horse on the outside of the starting gate and one (1) length behind the starting line. If the horse so stationed outside the starting gate by the starter dwells or refuses to break with the field and is thereby left at the post,

- there shall not be a refund of <u>pari-mutuel[parimutuel]</u> wagers on the horse nor refund of stakes
- 2 fees paid for the horse.
- 3 Section 11. Horses Failing to Finish. Any horse that starts in a race but does not cross the
- 4 finish line or is not ridden across the finish line by the jockey with whom it starts the race shall be
- 5 declared unplaced and shall receive no portion of the purse money.
- 6 Section 12. Fouls.
- 7 (1) A leading horse if clear is entitled to any part of the track.
- 8 (2) If a leading horse or any other horse in a race swerves or is ridden to either side so as
- 9 to interfere with, intimidate, or impede any other horse or jockey, or to cause the same result, this
- action shall be deemed a foul.
- 11 (3) If a jockey strikes another horse or jockey, it is a foul.
- 12 (4) If, in the opinion of the stewards, a foul alters the finish of a race, an offending horse
- may be disqualified by the stewards.
- Section 13. Stewards to Determine Foul Riding.
- 15 (1) A jockey shall make a best effort to control and guide his or her mount in such a way
- as not to cause a foul.
- 17 (2) The stewards shall take cognizance of riding that results in a foul, irrespective of
- whether or not an objection is lodged.
- 19 (3) If, in the opinion of the stewards, a foul is committed as a result of a jockey not making
- a best effort to control and guide his or her mount to avoid a foul, whether or not intentionally or
- 21 through carelessness or incompetence, the jockey may be penalized at the discretion of the
- 22 stewards.
- 23 Section 14. Horses to be Ridden Out.

- 1 (1) Every horse in every race shall be ridden so as to win or finish as near as possible to
  2 first and demonstrate the best and fastest performance of which it is capable at the time, while in
  3 compliance with Section 15 of this regulation.
  - (2) A horse shall not be eased up without adequate cause, even if it has no apparent chance to earn a portion of the purse money.
  - (3) A jockey who unnecessarily causes a horse to shorten stride may be penalized at the discretion of the stewards.
  - (4) Stewards shall take cognizance of any marked reversal of form of a horse and shall conduct inquiries of the licensed owner, licensed trainer, and all other persons connected with the horse.
  - (5) If the stewards find that the horse was deliberately restrained or impeded in any way or by any means so as not to win or finish as near as possible to first, any person found to have contributed to that circumstance may be penalized at the discretion of the stewards.
- Section 15. Use of Riding Crops.

- (1) Although the use of a riding crop is not required, a jockey who uses a riding crop during a race shall do so only in a manner consistent with exerting his or her best efforts to win.
- (2) In any race in which a jockey will ride without a riding crop, an announcement of that fact shall be made over the public address system.
- (3) An electrical or mechanical device or other expedient designed to increase or retard the speed of a horse, other than a riding crop approved by the stewards pursuant to 810 KAR 4:010, Section 11 shall not be possessed by anyone, or applied by anyone to a horse at any time at a location under the jurisdiction of the racing commission.

1	(4) A riding crop shall not be used on a two (2) year-old horse in races before April 1 of
2	each year.
3	(5) Allowable uses of a riding crop include the following:
4	(a) The riding crop may [shall only] be used at any time, without penalty, if, in the opinion

12	(c) Tapping[shall: (a) Show] the horse on the shoulder with the crop in the down position
13	while both hands are holding onto the reins[riding crop] and both hands are touching the neck
14	of[give] the horse; and
15	(d) Showing or waving the crop without contact with the horse and giving the horse time
16	to respond before striking the horse.[;]
17	(6) Use of[(b) Having used] the riding crop to make contact with a horse to maintain focus
18	and concentration, to control the horse for safety of the horse and rider, or to encourage a horse is
19	allowed, with the following exceptions:
20	(a) Use of the crop in any manner, other than underhanded or backhanded as set forth in
21	Section 15(5)(b), or tapping on the shoulder as set forth in Section 15(5)(c), resulting in more than
22	six (6) times in the overhand manner;

1	(b) Use of the crop and making contact with the horse more than two (2) successive strikes
2	without allowing[, give] the horse a chance to respond.
3	(c) Use of the crop with the rider's wrist above helmet height;
4	(d) Use of the crop [shall not be used to strike a horse:
5	(a)] on the head, flanks, or on any other part of its body other than the shoulders or
6	hindquarters;
7	(e) Use of the crop [hind quarters except if necessary to control a horse;
8	(b)] during the post parade or after the finish of the race except if necessary to control the
9	horse;
10	(f) Excessive or brutal use of the crop causing injury to the horse [(c) Excessively or
11	brutally];
12	(g) Use of the crop [(d)] causing welts or breaks in the skin;
13	(h) Use of the crop [(e)] if the horse is clearly out of the race or has obtained its maximum
14	placing; and
15	(i) Use of the crop [(f) Persistently] even though the horse is showing no response [under
16	the riding crop].
17	(8) A riding crop shall not be used to strike another person.
18	(9) After the race, a horse will[may] be subject to inspection by a racing official or official
19	veterinarian looking for cuts, welts, or bruises in the skin. Any adverse findings shall be reported
20	to the stewards.
21	(10) Use of the crop during workouts shall be permitted so long as such use does not violate
22	section 6(c) through (i).

1	(11) The giving of instructions by any licensee that, if obeyed, would lead to a violation of
2	this section may result in disciplinary action also being taken against the licensee who gave the
3	instructions.
4	(12) Only padded/shock absorbing riding crops which have not been modified in any way
5	may be carried in a race.
6	(13) During a race, if a jockey rides in a manner contrary to this rule, the stewards shall
7	impose a minimum fine of \$500.00, a minimum suspension of three (3) days, or both, if in the
8	opinion of the stewards, the violation is egregious or intentional. Factors in determining whether
9	a violation is egregious include, but are not limited to:
10	(a) recent history of similar violations;
11	(b) number of uses over the total and consecutive limits described in this Section; and
12	(c) using the crop in the overhanded position more than six (6) times.
13	Section 16. Other Means of Altering Performance. An electrical or mechanical appliance,
14	other than a riding crop, shall not be used to affect the speed of a horse in a race or workout. A
15	sponge or other object shall not be used to interfere with the respiratory system of a horse. Use or
16	nonuse of ordinary racing equipment shall be consistent and any change of equipment shall be
17	approved by the stewards.
18	Section 17. Official Order of Finish as to Pari-mutuel Parimutuel Payoff. Once satisfied
19	that the order of finish is correct and that the race has been properly run in accordance with the
20	rules and KAR Title 810[Titles 810 and 811], the stewards shall order that the official order of
21	finish be confirmed and the official sign posted for the race. The decision of the stewards as to the
22	official order of finish for pari-mutuel[parimutuel] wagering purposes shall be final, and no

In the year 2017, the Commission licensed over 22,000 individuals to participate in horse racing. This number is consistent from year to year.

In April and May of 2021, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission ("KHRC") staff received six (6) administrative requests from Churchill Downs Racetrack, LLC, by and through its whollyowned subsidiary Derby City Gaming, LLC ("Derby City Gaming"), to offer new historical horse racing ("HHR") terminals, pari-mutuel pools, system components, and entertaining game themes.

On March 19, 2021, the KHRC unanimously approved a process for classifying administrative requests relating to pari-mutuel wagering on HHR. As such, the KHRC expressly authorized the KHRC's Executive Director to approve or deny administrative requests related to HHR pursuant to KRS 230.230.

Gaming Laboratories International ("GLI") and BMM Testlabs, the independent third-party testing laboratories that provide contractual services for the KHRC, have tested all applicable software components listed below against current Kentucky statutes and regulations. KHRC staff has reviewed the certification reports submitted by both labs and believes that the certified components comply with all relevant Kentucky statutes and regulations. These certification reports are available for all KHRC members upon request.

After a thorough review of the requests, supporting documentation, and performing a field review of necessary components, the KHRC staff recommended conditional approval of the administrative requests by Executive Director Marc A. Guilfoil. Subsequently, Executive Director Guilfoil granted conditional approvals for the following HHR components requested by Derby City Gaming.

# **Date Preference System**

The following date system of preference is used at Kentucky Downs:

Foal certificates are no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Kentucky Downs; however, foal certificates (2017 and older) must be on file to obtain a preference date and to have a horse digitally tattooed. Foals and 2018 (and older) must assign their Digital Foal Certificates to Kentucky Downs in order to obtain a preference date.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses into over-filled races.

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot; however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- 2. All horses intended for racing at Kentucky Downs (who fulfill the criteria below) will be assigned a preference date. A horse can have only one date at any particular time. Dates assigned will be of two types:

#### E-Date

This date will correspond to: (a) the date on which a horse's foal papers and name card are submitted to the Identifier (foal certificates must be on file by 09/01/2021 to receive the earliest date.); (b) the day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the Identifier. To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race that appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race that failed to fill through insufficient entries.

#### R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Kentucky Downs. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse that scratches.

- 3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers are removed from the Identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Kentucky Downs. Additionally, horses racing at Kentucky Downs without foal papers on site will not retain their R-Date.
- 4. Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance (other than maiden dates).
- 5. Maiden dates will be kept separately and will not have preference in winners' races.
- 6. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an un-split same-owner entry.
- 7. A horse that has been placed on a list (Veterinarian, Steward, Starter, or Paddock Judge) will lose his date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day he is removed from the list.
- 8. Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races and will be assigned post positions in the order of their dates, earliest dates first.
- 9. A horse that is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain his previous date.



- 10. The draw of stake and handicap races is not subject to date preference.
- 11. Preference dates are transferred through change in ownership and changes in trainer only after the proper transfer procedures have been completed through the Stewards' Office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- 12. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility, or scratches.

#### DATE PREFERENCE SYSTEM

The Date System of preference will be used at Churchill Downs as described below:

Foal Certificates and digital foal certificates no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Churchill Downs; however, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse tattooed.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses in over-filled races.

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot, however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- 2. All horses intended for racing at Churchill Downs will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:
- 3. **FOR A ZERO DATE** foal papers and digital foal papers must be turned in to the identifier by Thursday, September 16, 2021.

#### E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a) The day on which a horse's foal papers or digital foal papers are submitted to the identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting). An unnamed horse will not receive an E-date.
- b) The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers or digital foal papers are not on file with the identifier.

To qualify for the latter E-date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

#### R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Churchill Downs. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches.

- 4. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers or digital papers are removed from the identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another race track will forfeit any date they may have at Churchill Downs.
- 5. Preference dates will consist of two categories: Dirt (D) and Turf (T). Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance.
- 6. A horse that runs in a race, which has been taken off the turf will retain its turf date. A scratched horse will receive an R-date from the date scratched.
- 7. When a race is taken off the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will receive an R-Date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will retain their previous date and will not be permitted to start.
- 8. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.

- 9. A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list.
- 10. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a cancelled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
- 11. The draw of stakes and handicap race is not subject to date preference.
- 12. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's office.
- 13. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- 14. Winners will be preferred in all non maiden races.

#### **CONDITION PREFERENCE**

Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded Stakes winners (Grade I-II-III), providing the horse has finished 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> for \$40,000 or more since starting for less than \$40,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$25,000 will not be preferred.

## WINNERS ARE PREFERRED IN ALL NON-MAIDEN RACES.

# Also-Eligibles

If there are any scratches in a race with also-eligibles, the also-eligible horses will be permitted to move into the race in the order listed on the overnight.

# 810 KAR 4:010. HORSES

The stewards may at any time require presentation of a horse's registration certificate, virtual certificate, or racing permit or other proof of ownership.

Upon claim, sale or any other transfer of ownership, the horse's registration certificate or racing permit shall be given to the new owner, and any virtual certificate shall be transferred to the new owner electronically. The new owner shall report the change in ownership to the stewards.
